Chairman's Report

2020 was a year like none other. Our community and country experienced the triple crises of a once-in-a-generation public health emergency, its economic ramifications, and the social unrest stemming from police brutality laid bare by videotapes of shocking acts of police killings.

I am pleased to report that the dedicated staff at Gwen Cherry Park made the necessary adjustments and sacrifices to ensure that the children and families of the park were provided much needed food, water, supplies, information, and online educational and organizational services. All of this was in strict accordance with the COVID-19 protocols that were issued by Miami -Dade County. In addition to regular park services on-line and in person, Park staff worked above and beyond the call of duty to coordinate distribution of thousands of hot meals for families; hundreds of bags of food for pets (dogs and cats); 500 turkeys for Thanksgiving; 911 Christmas toys, and hundreds of book bags, tablets and other school supplies. The highlight of the year was the Dedication of the park's new state-of-the-art \$1.5 million Synthetic Athletic Field. Funding for the Field was provided by the NFL Foundation and the Miami-Dade County Parks Department. The Dedication was held during Super Bowl festivities here in Miami and was attended by NFL Commissioner Roger Goodell, Miami Dolphins' Owner Steve Ross, District 2 County Commissioner Jean Monestime, Miami Dolphins' Legends Nat Moore and Dwight Stephenson, and many more dignitaries, community members and

children from the park. Speaking on behalf of the Gwen Cherry Park Foundation, Inc., I welcomed the dignitaries and community members to the "Park of Champions", and noted that after winning six National Pop Warner Football Championship that it is fitting that Gwen Cherry Park now has a championship athletic field where quality football, soccer and la crosse can played. THANK YOU to the Gwen Cherry Park's staff, the After School Program's staff, and our community volunteers for providing helping to serve our community during this time of crisis. You allowed many in our community to believe as I do LIFE IS GOOD!

SYNTHETIC ATHLETIC FIELD DEDICATION 2020

On January 30, 2020, a Dedication Ceremony was held at Gwen Cherry Park to celebrate the unveiling of the new \$1.6 million state-of-the-art Synthetic Athletic Field. The Field was built with funds donated by the NFL Foundation and Miami-Dade County, and will allow youth to play football, soccer and lacrosse. In addition to the Field, a new scoreboard and padded bleachers were installed. The Dedication Ceremony was part of the week-long festivities of Super Bowl LIV held in Miami Gardens. Along with the Dedication Ceremony, the youth participated in NFL Huddle for 100, and Urban Farming. Gwen Cherry Park Foundation's Chairman H.T. Smith welcomed the visitors and community members to the Park where champions are made. Smith told the crowd that the Gwen Cherry Bulls have won six National Pop Warner Football Championships, two National Dance Championships and a National Cheerleading Championship. Some of the many dignitaries who attended the Dedication Ceremony included Roger Goodell, NFL Commissioner; Stephen Ross, Miami Dolphins Owner; Rodney Barreto, Chairman of the Super Bowl Host Committee; District 2 County Commissioner Jean Monestime; Jackie Nespral, NBC 6 Newscaster; Dwight Stephenson, former Miami Dolphins Hall of Fame Center; Nat Moore, Miami Dolphin's legend, and Audrey Edmondson, County Commission Chairwoman. After the program, the youth "christened" the athletic field by running a series of football drills that were participated in by girls and boys. The youth also planting flowers and trees as a part of the new Urban Farming program. Fun was had by all!



Recreational Programming Summer Camp & Virtual Learning



Gwen Cherry Park Summer Camp was a huge success with providing youth with an eight week camp. On a daily basis participants were being taught life and social skills through play and sport. Our participants were gaining mentorship in the following areas: teamwork, communication, and perseverance. We utilizing our new multi-purpose synthetic turf field for the development of athletic skills, by way of drills, and football combine like activities. Our youth had an amazing time collaborating and competing with each other. With safety measure in place, we maintained a 9:1 ratio with participants and counselors. Youth were separated in cohorts with their personal Arts and Crafts supplies an athletic equipment. Additional monitors were provided by our department for supervision and sanitization. Throughout the summer we used almost every square inch of our park to maintain a physical distance and still provide a fun driven experience for our campers. Once public schools were re-opened, we were able to service families that needed their children to do virtual school in a safe and supervised environment

at the NFL YET Center. Participants were assisted with staying on task and provided activities in between classes for engagement, creativity, and enrichment while utilizing our multipurpose rooms as classroom settings. Public schools provided laptops and hotspots, while the NFL Yet Center provided monitors to supervise youth and a safe environment for students to learn.





BOYS AND GIRLS CLUB OF MIAMI Skills Camp



Gwen Cherry Park NFL YET Center has an active program partnership with the Boys and Girls Club of Miami who provides our year around youth sport activities. Unfortunately, this year's sports season was canceled due to the pandemic. With proper planning between the NFL YET Center and the Boys and Girls Club, an an eight week Skills Camp was provided to youth in our area. COVID prescreening was implemented before each season, masks were worn by players and coaches, safety measures were put in place to ensure we maintained a 9:1 ratio for players and coaching staff. Spectators were required to remain in their vehicles and other guidelines were implemented to ensure the safety of our youth participants.

This important event was a smashing success that came at a time when so many families are reeling financially as a result of the economic hardships caused by the COVID-19 pandemic.

Fourth Annual Christmas Festival




